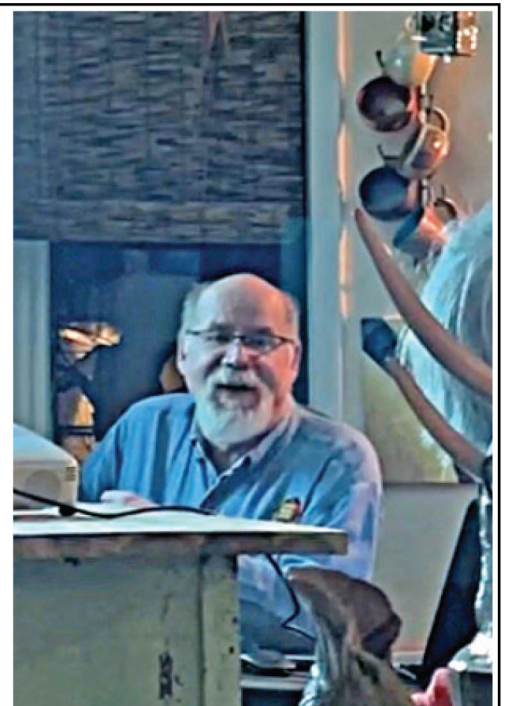


STEGNER DINNER RETURNS

The Town of Eastend invites applications for 2 Full Time Summer Student/ Seasonal Employees and 1 Full Time/Seasonal Campground Manager

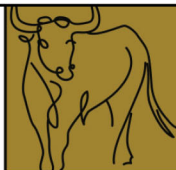

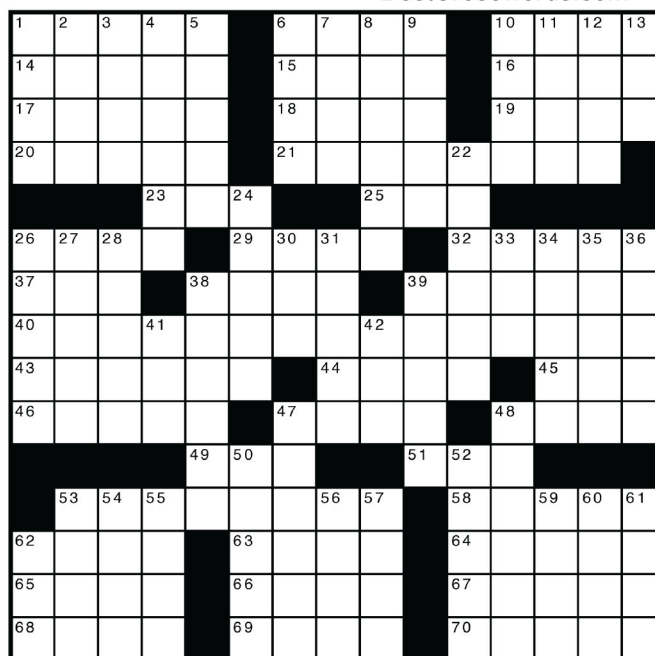

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
