 COVID put a pause on the annual Arnal

Brothers Bursary hockey tournament and this weekend the tournament returns.

For those who may not know, the Arnal family has suffered the loss of three of their boys tragically when young. They formed the Arnal Memorial Bursary as a way to cope with their situation, as a way to affirm the dedication to agriculture, the work ethic, and personalities of the boys that made their family so proud. So each year the applications (with realistic cost projections and possible returns) are all read and evaluated before winners are chosen. The bursary recipients are young people who have goals and aspirations in the area of agriculture. It could be a young rancher wanting to buy their first bull, or an inventor wanting a way to make agricultural improvements or inventions a reality.

Each year in December there is a bred heifer sale at the Bircham Ranch where the money raised goes towards the bursary. One consignor usually donates a heifer to the auction, and each year Crescent Point Energy has generously purchased a bull and then donated it back to be auctioned again. I have been to many of the bursary award ceremonies and am impressed at the maturity and drive of the young recipients, especially when I think about the activities my friends and I engaged in at that age. This weekend, the party is at the Hall and Rink with live music, good food, and silent auctions to help raise more money for the cause. If you want to avoid the party but support the cause, donations to the bursary are accepted any day of the year at Innovation Credit Union.

Our Amazing Sense of hearing

Over three million Canadians have hearing loss. Hearing involves communication, and hearing loss affects relationships. We will describe how our ears work and how we hear. The outer, middle and inner ears each do very different things, and they fit together in an amazing way. We will also explain types of hearing loss, what they look like on a hearing test and also, the interesting effects of hearing loss on the understanding of speech.

Hearing in the Animal Kingdom

This is a survey of hearing in the animal kingdom. We begin with fish, and then move on to amphibians, then reptiles, then birds, and then mammals (including dogs, cats, dolphins & bats). Through our tour, it is fascinating to see the changes in ear anatomy. We won't stop at mammals though; hearing in the world of insects is absolutely fascinating. Some ear structures in insects are actually giving new ideas about sound amplification in hearing aids!

YEARS GONE BY JANUARY

100 Years Ago – 1923

I.S. Topham and Miss G.H. Stenhouse were married in Regina on Dec. 23, 1922. Attendants were Miss Vera Earl of Swift Current and George Forsyth of Eastend.

Eastend School opened on January 3 with an enrollment of 160 students.

Mrs. M.T. Strong will open a health and complexion parlor, for ladies only, at the former Wilton residence. She is the agent for the famous Welch Beauty Clay treatment and will also give beauty exercises, healthful drills and electric treatment.

A hog club, for purpose of promoting a desirable type of hog, has been formed under the auspices of the Eastend Agric. Society. The recommended hog for markets is the Yorkshire followed by the Tamworth. Representing the North Bench is J.R. Humphries, the South Bench is J.F. Gregory and C. Holmes for the Cloverly district.

Messrs. W.G. Bock and H.T. Halvorson left to attend the Grain Growers' Convention at Saskatoon.

90 Years Ago – 1933

No papers available for January.

80 Years Ago – 1943

A letter was received from James Kearney of Ravenscrag who is stationed with the R.C.A.F. on the island of Ceylon.

If suitable accommodation can be found, Robsart will have an egg candling station. Producers will then be able to get the highest prices for their graded eggs.

Following other small towns in the province, Eastend has set up a fund for refugee relief in Russia. Contributions can be left at the office of R.A. Snider, who will then forward funds to Regina. The Russians have been resisting Nazi invasion and some 70 million women and children have been rendered homeless. A New Year's Eve dance at Robsart with the Schweigert Swingsters raised \$200 for Russian relief fund.

The Wednesday half holiday bylaw came into effect and all retail stores will close Wednesday afternoons until August 31st.

Dig out your old moccasins and get ready for a dance on the ice at the Ice Carnival. This will include races, jumping, fancy comic and novelty dress events, a broomball game and a moccasin dance.

Sask. farmers are urged to raise more hogs. Canada will have to market 8,000,000 hogs to fill it's share of the bacon contract with the British government. Eddie Wills will ship hogs to Swift Current.

The Eastend Sheep and Livestock Cooperative has been organized with a membership of 30. Shares in the association are a minimum of 50 shares at \$10 with a maximum of 200 shares. The Bank of Montreal has issued a loan enabling the association to spend \$17,000 on sheep, sheep are averaging \$9 a head. A camp has been set up in the valley with good, comfortable living quarters for the herdsmen.

It is illegal to mutilate or destroy any kind of cotton or jute bag owing to curtailed shipments of jute from India. Every bag is essential – don't hoard bags, keep them moving.

Thermometer dropped to -47.5F on Jan. 22nd. This is the coldest temperature recorded since Feb. 1936 when the temperature dropped to -54.5F.

Larson and MacIntyre is urging farmers to order repair parts now. The government is restricting stocks of machine parts to \$30 of any one part. Warehouses may add to their stocks only as repair parts are sold. This could mean long delays for receiving parts.

70 Years Ago – 1953

60 Years Ago – 1963

The Sask. Highway Driver Education and Training Program is gaining momentum with over 3000 students participating. This plan is the only one of its kind in Canada, with the bulk of cost borne by the Sask. Government Insurance Office.

After a black Christmas in many parts of our area, temperatures at Consul have been up to 40F above, not what the skaters and curlers want. A cold wave hit with a bang of January 9th with temperatures dropping to -30F.

Mr. and Mrs. Frank Barroby celebrated their golden anniversary in Medicine Hat. Mr. Barroby came from Yorkshire, England in 1901 and in 1906 started farming near the mouth of the Frenchman Creek. Marion Phillips came to Canada from Wales in 1912, with her parents to visit her brother, Aubrey, who was living near the White Mud River. Mr. Barroby and Miss Phillips were married in January 1913 in Aubrey's house. During the First World War, Mr. Barroby served with the Lord Strathcona Light Horse in France. In the Second World War, he joined the 38th Company of the Veteran's Guard of Canada and was stationed at the prisoner-of-war camp in Medicine Hat. The Barroby's retired in 1945 to Medicine Hat and their son, Ryott took over the ranch.

Screenings was one of the bright spots of the Enterprise, but Billie Bock has decided that the pressures of meeting a weekly deadline are too much for a young fellow. Even though his friends will readily admit that he wasn't always right and even those who didn't always like what he wrote will grant that he wasn't always wrong, both will agree that Screenings is going to be missed.

Texas Oil Co. is advertising for a man, over 40, to work in the Shaunavon area at a salary of \$15,000 a year.

Mr. Bill Fische of Wakaw has replaced Mr. F. Russell at the Eastend Branch of the Bank of Montreal. Mr. Russell has been transferred to Rosthern, SK.

Bill's Fine Foods of Eastend has been listed for sale.

The Cub and Scout Hall was sold to the highest bidder, George Galbraith.

Robert James Humphrey, 19 year old son of Mr. & Mrs. Edward Humphrey, died in a mining accident at Thompson, Manitoba.

Mrs. Angus McLeod, age 57 of Creston, BC and David Gordon, age 51 years of Eastend passed away after brief illnesses.

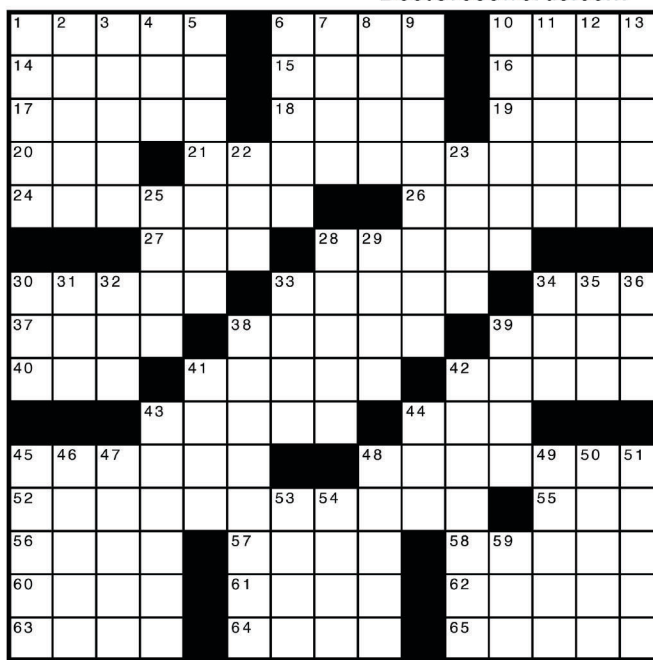


