YEARS GONE BY FEBRUARY

100 Years Ago - 1923

Mr. Francis Roy passed away following injuries received in an accident at a logging camp in Idaho where he and his 2 sons had leased a sawmill for the winter.

Mr. Ed Banford, while digging a well on his farm, struck a vein of aqua and the same is considered a valuable find.

Dr. J.K. Pomeroy was the physician and surgeon with Dr. H. Douglas as the local dentist. Mr. W. Dishington was the tailor with his shop on Main (Maple) north of the hotel. Men's and ladies clothing were available at the W. Miller & Co. Store.

A horse hair robe, belonging to Mr. Chris Jensen, was stolen from Morrison's Livery Barn. The culprit was caught and sentenced to 2 months hard labour in Regina.

90 Years Ago - 1933

Dr. S.E. Burnham and Dr. Belkin were the local physicians and surgeons and Dr. Henderson was the dentist.

Caraganas can easily be grown from seed. Two pounds of caragana seeds may be obtained free of charge by applying to the Dominion Nursery Station at Indian Head.

80 Years Ago - 1943

Two boys were born on Feb.17, nearly simultaneously in the Eastend Hospital. A son, Morley, born to May and Art Taylor and a son, John, born to Ruth and Frank Cursons. On Feb.16, a son was born to Mr. & Mrs. D. J. McCuaig in the Shaunavon Hospital.

The butter ration for February will be 2 pounds instead of the former 3 pounds per person. New ration books are available for pick up, the old books must be turned in. There is also a tea ration of 1 oz. weekly per person.

All retailers who handle tooth paste and shaving cream in tubes cannot sell a tube without having one turned in. These will then be turned into the nearest drug store. Announced by Deputy Admin. of Used Goods, Wartime Prices and the Trade Board.

Charlie Purgstaller has purchased the south half of the Hudson's Bay land, a mile west of Ravenscrag and plans to eventually make his home there.

The residents of Robsart and surrounding area have subscribed to the Russian Relief Fund. They have made 78 quilts and sent them overseas through the I.O.D.E. and Salvation Army.

The Eastend Legion has sent 300 cigarettes apiece to 26 local men who are overseas.

Pete Chourrout has donated a colt to the Red Cross to be raffled off to raise funds for the organization. He also donated one a year ago.

Between 300-500 youths in the 17-18 age group will be enlisted for special trade training in the Canadian Army. They must have an A medical category, a grade 9 education and written consent of a parent or guardian. They will not be sent overseas until they reach of age of 19.

70 Years Ago - 1953

Troopers Maurice Priddle, Len Wehr, Gilbert Kopitoski and Cliff Verpy of the Lord Strathcona Horse Armored Unit spent leave in Eastend prior to embarking for active service in Korea.

Mrs. T. St. Hilaire, a pioneer of the Dollard district, passed away in Log Angeles at 78 yrs. Mr. & Mrs. St. Hilaire came to Canada in 1910 and homesteaded in the Fort Roy district, 2.5 miles south of Dollard. Here they built their home and opened a store and lumberyard, naming the store Dollard. When the railroad came through they sold the store and built the 3 story hotel in Dollard owning the first car in the district. The first grave in the Dollard cemetery was that of Hilaire's son, Armand, who was thrown from a horse and died. In 1923 the family moved to Washington.

John Morrison of Robsart has taken a position on the Ravenscrag School staff where he is in charge of the high school students.

William Johnston has received his diploma in diesel and auto engineering after passing his examinations in Edmonton.

Jack Wilkinson is now in Calgary, employed by the Brett Exploration Co. His family will reside here until the end of the school term.

At the Town council meeting a motion was made to appoint Ross Smith as the town constable at a salary of \$75 per month. A motion was also made that a bounty of 25 cents per rat tail be continued provided that the rat was caught within the town limits.

60 Years Ago - 1963

Miss M. Dallas is the librarian of the Eastend Community Library.

The men's bonspiel opened with 31 rinks entered. Out of town rinks were 2 from Shaunavon, 1 from Robsart and 3 from Dollard.

Lowell Anderson passed away in Shaunavon Hospital following a lengthy illness at the age of 32. He is survived by his wife, the former Ethel Lewis and 4 small children.

Dr. J. Adamson has joined the EUH staff, opening his practice in the office previously occupied by Dr. Powell. His wife and family, still in Scotland, will join him in the spring. Mrs. Hazel Dordu is his receptionist.

50 Years Ago - 1973

A meeting was held in Eastend with representation of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Canada to plan for the organization of a new congregation in Eastend. Plans are to buy or build a parsonage and with the placement of a fulltime minister about midsummer develop an ongoing congregational ministry here.

The Tommy Hunter show's guest star is Ronnie Prophet, who is the first cousin of Eastend resident, Hazel Noble.

Mrs. Mary Routledge is the librarian for the Eastend Branch of the Chinook Regional Library.

Funeral services were held for Richard Larose, 21 and Donald Johnson, 26 whose deaths occurred in separate car accidents only hours apart, but over 200 miles apart. Donald is survived by his wife, Irene, and 2 young sons.

Members of the Swift Current Bronco Hockey Club are coming to Eastend to give instruction to PeeWee, Bantam and Midget hockey players.

The Eastend Square Dance Club held a dance with dancers coming from Swift Current, Waldeck, Havre, Shaunavon, Bracken, Loomis and Frontier. Fourteen squares were on the floor at one time.

Due to poor snow conditions in the Cypress Hills area, the Cypress Hills Winter Carnival has been cancelled.

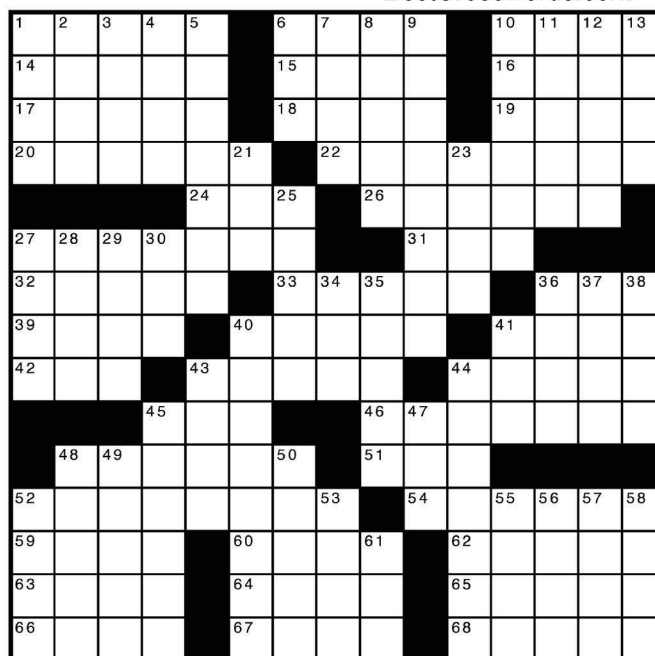


