The Eastend Communities in Blooms (a committee of the town of Eastend) has received 20 white spruce seedlings for free from the Shand Greenhouse operated by Sask Power! These seedlings are meant to provide shelter belts and/or preserve the riverbanks and animal habitat in order to qualify for receiving the seedlings.

In the past, free seedlings had been planted around the river at the camp ground, but with a lower success rate than we had hoped for. This year the committee planted 10 seedlings on Anne Arnal’s property, north of Elm Street across the berm where small evergreens were naturally growing under a tree! We are hoping our seedlings will thrive there as a nursery spot until we can transplant them on town property in the future. The other 10 seedlings were planted temporarily on the east side of the berm on the wildlife reserve land. Again, we noticed that small evergreens were naturally growing there.

Thank you to Joan Hodgins and Beth Humphrey for planting the seedlings and special thank you to Anne Arnal for generously allowing us to use her land as a temporary spot for the seedlings!

The Committee was also delighted to receive another \$215.00 in donations from patrons of the Blue Dog Cafe to help fund future re-treering of public lands/streets in Eastend! Thank you! The funds have been deposited with the Town of Eastend and earmarked for our tree projects in the future similar to the first donation of \$425.00 from the patrons of The Blue Dog Cafe.

- TOWN OF EASTEND
- Bylaw No. 690/2011
- A Bylaw to provide for the Licensing, Regulation and Controlling of Dogs and Cats.

The Town of Eastend would like to remind residents of our Animal Bylaw regarding licensing dogs and cats and animals running at large.

-Licence year is from January 1 to December 31 of each year, all cats and dogs over three months of age must be licensed.

- The owner of a dog shall ensure the dog is not running at large, which means it must be on a leash no longer than two metres, under control of the owner and licensed.

- If the dog defecates on public or private property it must be cleaned up immediately.

- The owner of a cat shall ensure the cat is not running at large, which means it needs to be licensed and not off the premises of its owners, unless the cat is under proper control of its owner.

-If animals are witnessed running at large, they will impounded by Town of Eastend Public Works Department or by the Regional Bylaw Enforcement Officer, and a violation will be issued; further, if the animals are unable to be caught, a violation can still be issued.

Saskatchewan's economy is experiencing rapid growth, fuelled by strong commodity prices and increased private-sector investment. Over 20,000 new jobs were added in 2022, and this growth has continued into 2023; we now have a record number of people working in the province. Our strong economy allows Saskatchewan to invest in further growth for the future.

To ensure growth continues, our government is investing in the new Sustainable Canadian Agricultural Partnership (Sustainable CAP) with the federal government. Throughout the five-year agreement, over \$89 million annually will be invested in strategic programming for farmers, ranchers and agri-businesses, which represents a 25 per cent increase over the previous agreement.

Sustainable CAP puts a continued focus on agricultural research and increased support for water development. These investments will continue to strengthen the competitiveness, innovation and resiliency of Saskatchewan's agriculture sector for years to come.

To help grow our province's export-based economy, our government is investing in a strong international presence. Saskatchewan will open a new international trade office in Germany, bringing us to a total of nine international trade offices across the world. The efforts of these trade offices are paying off – merchandise exports rose 41.6 per cent 2021 to 2022. More exports abroad means more jobs here at home.

The strong economy allows us to invest in people and communities right here in Saskatchewan. This year's budget provides \$503 million in direct support for Saskatchewan's growing municipalities, an increase of 12.1 per cent from last year. This includes Municipal Revenue Sharing, which will reach a record \$297.9 million this year, up 13.4 per cent from last year's budget. Municipal Revenue Sharing provides predictable, no-strings-attached funding to use as local leaders see fit as they grow and build strong communities.

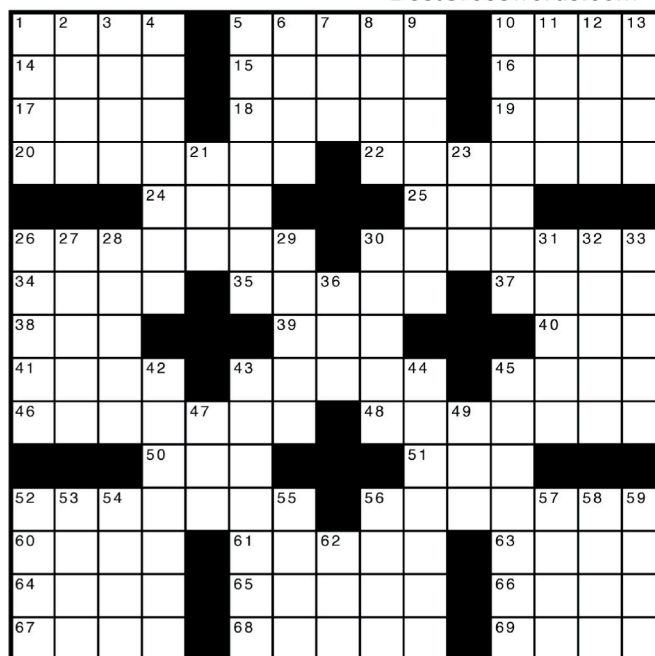
