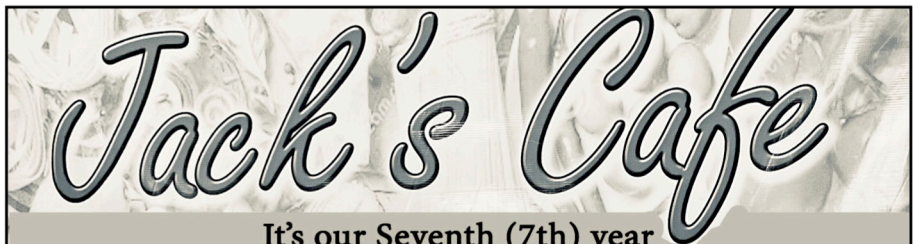

For many years I had been looking for a way to honor this land.

The inception of this project theme began when Todd Millions brought me Library of Congress reports that included our local marsh lake as a travel-for-trade waterway. =Remarkably, reports and charts regarding this lake was not to be found through Hudson Bay Trading Post, nor N-W-M-P historical information. However, Corky Jones wrote about seeing Anxiety Bute reflected on the lake's waters.

There is no question that this project's depiction of our connecting thread between Hudson Bay and the Gulf of Mexico would have been accomplished ... without Nick Saville and access to his potter's workshop.

Passing on the street I casually asked Nick about how much clay shrinkage I should plan the pattern for. Shortly after which he offered me six weeks of workbench use if I used his white-mud-clay which he would donate along with the glazes and kiln firing sessions.

When I arrived with pattern part cut-outs and my pastry rolling pin ... he showed me the flat-tile rolling table he had driven all the way to Calgary to pick up the day before.

Nick is the one who envisioned metal to house this tile-art jigsaw.

He picked the viewing height and angle and found the artisans to craft the elegant concrete and iron fabrication jobs. I picked the pierced-brushed stainless-steel plaques against black metal sheeting.

Nick pulled the flat tile paddies and variegated the mortar side while I cut out the tile shapes and coordinated the pattern layout.

I painted on the glaze and Nick managed all of the kiln work.

Between us we produced pounds of warped and curling discards.

From the beginning, Nick decided that we should pay for the project to get accomplished sooner than waiting for funding.

Then we got a very generous surprise contribution.

Both of us can't find the words to express how grateful we are to Kylie for orchestrating the transportation and installment of this monument to our local place in history.

I can deeply understand his trust and fondness for her.

WELL DONE NICK ... this honor for the land would not exist without you.

Now that a few weeks have passed, has it all sunk in how amazing your climb to the top has been? Does this fuel your fire to go even harder?

It sure does , its hard to get there it's even harder to stay on top.

Do you have a standout memory from Calgary Stampede that will stay with you always?

The victory lap on the horse , and walking onto the stage to receive my bronze. and the moment I got off my final ride.

Does this make you want to work harder in school ?

Nope, I already work hard in school. 🤔🤔

This year you've been on a winning streak in Kindersley and Ponoka before taking it all in Calgary. Where's the next place the people of Eastend will be able to cheer on our own Champ?

My next goal is the Canadian Finals Rodeo in Red Deer in November. I have quite few rodeos left and I'm sitting good in the standings but the job isn't finished





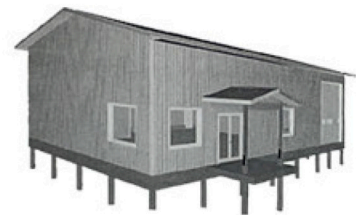
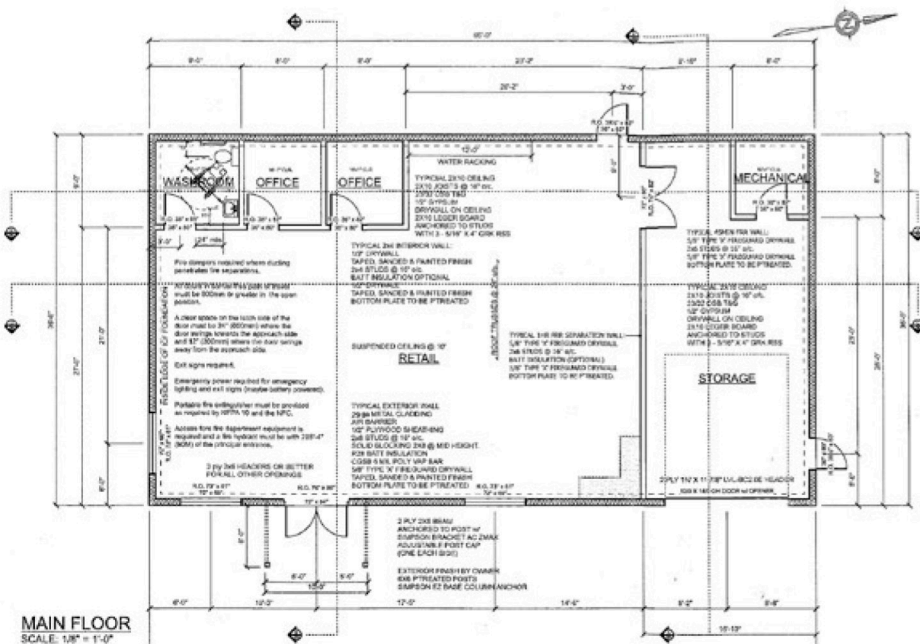

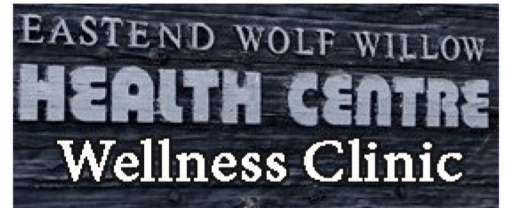

Zane donated the proceeds from two days worth of sales made in middle of the blazing heat.

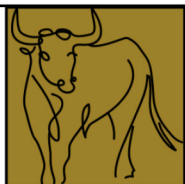

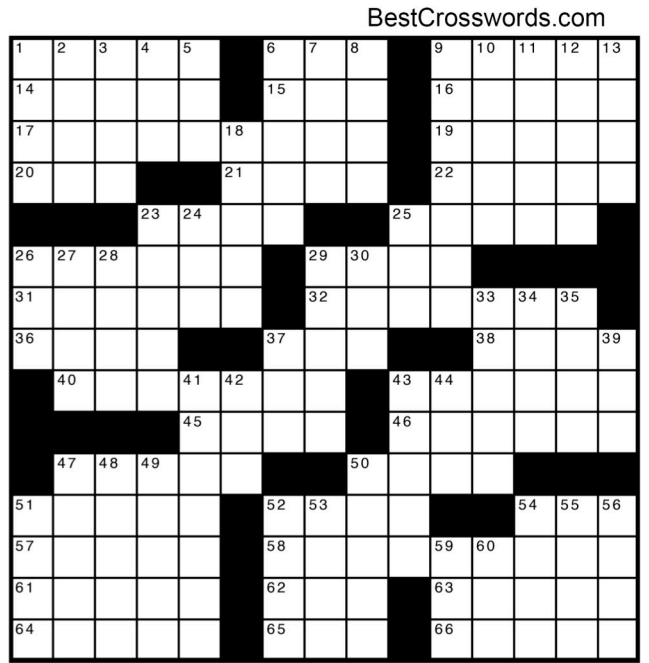
