### 2024 CHANGES TO SGI SERVICE LINE

HSB Canada currently offers SERVICE LINE coverage for homeowners to a limit of \$10,000 coverage for the service lines that connect a home to outside utility lines (underground: pipes, propane or natural gas lines, and electrical service and data lines) on the customer's property if any of those lines fail or are accidentally damaged.

- Starting in 2024 at renewal time of existing home policies, the limit for any service line older than 50 years will be reduced from \$10,000 to \$2,500.
- If several service lines on the property are damaged in the same incident, a customer can make a claim of up to \$10,000, with a limit of \$2,500 each for lines that haven't been replaced for 50 or more years.
  - This coverage limit is tied to the age of the service line, not the age of the home. If a line on the property was installed or replaced within the last 50 years, it may still be covered to \$10,000.

### Eastend Welcomes International Students

In 2006, Principal Kristy Sletten of the Hazelet school was in drastic need of students to fill seats or the school was facing closure. Little did she know when she created the Chinook International Program that she was creating a community that would stretch across borders and oceans and would extend to other communities in Saskatchewan.

Meet Lindsay. She is pictured here with Willie and Jasper, part of the first students to attend Eastend School from the program.

Lindsay attended school in Hazelet in 2006 when that school started the International Student program. After graduating from high school, she started working in the program in 2009. Over 200 students from all over the world have taken part in the program at Hazelet. Eastend is just beginning to write their part of the ongoing and successful story of the Chinook International Program.

I asked Lindsay about her experience with the program and here is what she said:

*I'm very lucky that through this program I got to travel a lot to promote it, I got to meet students from all over and see countries that I wouldn't have otherwise had a chance to see. It's been amazing for the Hazelet community to have grown to include a lot of international extended family.*

*For example: we had a student from Switzerland come to Hazelet in the program and four years later the student brought her whole family (and a motorhome) from Switzerland to Canada and drove all the way from Halifax to Hazelet and spent 10 days.*

*We also had a couple who hosted a student that flew to Columbia for their students wedding.*

*It's a good thing for bringing diversity as well as an economic driver with more population in communities and when families come to visit our small towns it brings even more.*

*We might think they wouldn't want to come here, and for a lot of them the first 5-10 days it's a shock. But, out of 200 students over the years only 3 or 4 have given up and left because they couldn't handle it.*

*We can undervalue what we have here in small towns. 2 million people vs. 500 people means less traffic and crime. The kids become part of the extended community and get to experience different things like our holidays and customs.*

*It's a great opportunity option for rural schools with empty seats in classrooms. Having 2 or 3 extra students can also add a lot of diversity to a school, and our kids get benefits of learning these other cultures as well.*

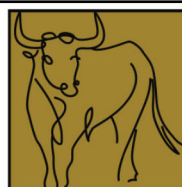

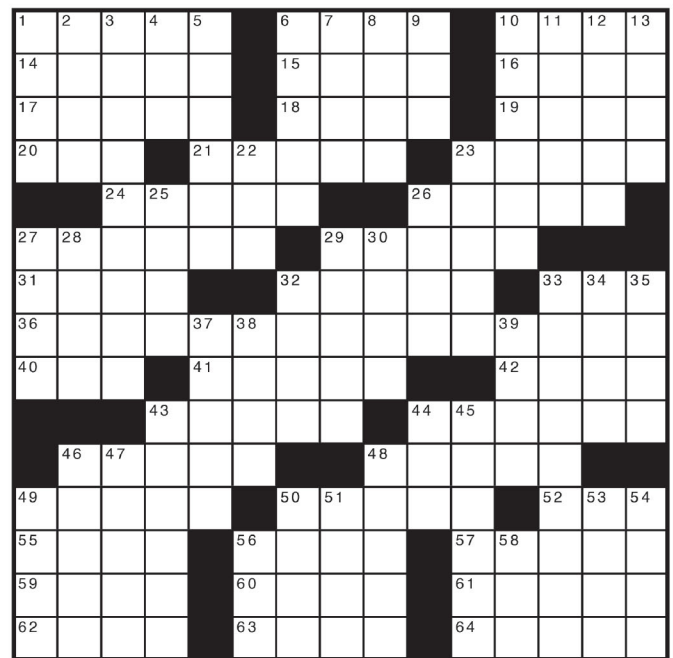
