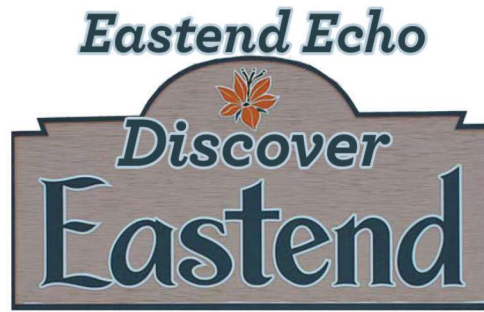

2024 CHANGES TO SGI SERVICE LINE

HSB Canada currently offers SERVICE LINE coverage for homeowners to a limit of \$10,000 coverage for the service lines that connect a home to outside utility lines (underground: pipes, propane or natural gas lines, and electrical service and data lines) on the customer's property if any of those lines fail or are accidentally damaged.

- Starting in 2024 at renewal time of existing home policies, the limit for any service line older than 50 years will be reduced from \$10,000 to \$2,500.
- If several service lines on the property are damaged in the same incident, a customer can make a claim of up to \$10,000, with a limit of \$2,500 each for lines that haven't been replaced for 50 or more years.
 - This coverage limit is tied to the age of the service line, not the age of the home. If a line on the property was installed or replaced within the last 50 years, it may still be covered to \$10,000.

100 Years Ago – 1924

A new provincial law bars public hall dancing for budding flappers and young gallants under the age of 18 years. This also applies to pool hall keepers who are not allowed to admit boys under 18. A new town bylaw will prohibit children up to 15 years of age from roaming the streets and a curfew bell will be rang every nite at 9:00 pm.

A free 3-day school, arranged by Wright and Jickling, has an expert coming from the John Deere Plow Co. The operation, construction and care of the Waterloo Boy tractor and stationary engines were covered with 30- 35 attending.

The CGIT of Eastend held their first Mother and Daughter Banquet with over 100 attending.

The Whitemud River has almost completed its annual ice crop of the season. W. Torkelson, with his gang of huskies, are cutting and hauling ice from the river; filling the local ice houses, besides shipping 8 cars to Shaunavon, Aneroid and Admiral. The Whipple-Cornish ice cutting gang at Ravenscrag have concluded their operation for the season, after shipping about 30 cars of ice this winter. A good demand for Whitemud River ice comes in from towns along the line due to the fact that river ice is considered better than ice cut from lakes or reservoirs where the water is dead water.

A land deal of interest in Ravenscrag happened last week when Wm. S. Gale purchased the greater part of the unsubdivided portion of the Ravenscrag townsite from the CPR.

One case of smallpox was reported in town this week.

80 Years Ago – 1944

Jake and Johnny Armstrong are making hunting and trapping a profitable business – to date they have caught 140 coyotes.

70 Years Ago – 1954

At a ceremony at the RCAF station at Comox, BC, J.E. Olmsted of Robsart was awarded a Coronation medal for loyalty and devotion to duty.

The Tide Water Assoc. Oil Co. group has completed another producer in the Dollard medium gravity oil field. They have drilled 11 producers in this field so far.

Mr. and Mrs. Albert Lacey have left for a 3 month stay in England, sailing out of St. John's on the Empress of France. Mr. Lacey's mother has been patiently waiting for years for her son's visit home.

60 Years Ago – 1964

Loggers have been busy felling all the trees on the north side of the school yard. The trees were planted about 40 years ago by Harry Stredwick. Tremendous growth was made when Eastend had irrigation but when this source of moisture was cut off due to the installation of sewage, the trees began to gradually die.

Eastend Jets have come out of their slump and have won their last couple of games against Climax and Shaunavon. Leading the way in scoring was Robert Eglund with a hat trick. It was one of Bob's best games of the year as he was skating, checking and over all playing like the Bob Eglund of old. Danny McLean, in the Eastend cage, also played a great game.

Dr. J. A. Bain arrived in Eastend and has opened his practice next door to the municipal office.

50 Years Ago – 1974

A farewell party was held for Austin and Irene Harlick who are now residing in Swift Current.

A dance was held at the Memorial Hall with the new group "Up Canada" playing. The band consists of Henry Shufletoski, Bob McAtamney, Garth Helle and Levi Pinlac.

The first Eastend Hospital was established in an abandoned restaurant in 1915 with Matron Miss Pattison. The hospital closed in 1917 due to lack of funds and reopened in 1918 during the flu epidemic when the school was used for patient overflow. The Red Cross managed the hospital from 1919 – 1924. The Jubilee Hospital was built in 1927 with 6 beds. The present Eastend Health Centre was opened in Jan. 1948 as a 13-bed hospital. Mrs. Howe, matron of the Jubilee Hospital, was the first matron in the new Centre. In 1968 the Centre was enlarged to include a solarium, bathroom facilities in most rooms and a nursery. The Jubilee hospital, used as the Nurse's residence for many years, is now being demolished through the LIP (Local Improvement Program), by Howard Lacey and his crew.

The new home of Mr. & Mrs. Mel Bascom on Front St. was displayed to the public. The proud contractors are Larry Pierce and Howard Lacey.

For the first time since the 1966-67 season, the Eastend Jets finished in first place in the Whitemud Senior Hockey League. Brian Reinbolt and Ed Grubbe lead the goal getters netting 22 goals each. Dwight Currie was the leading play maker with 25 assists and 18 goals. Only one player, Brian Reinbolt played all 18 games.

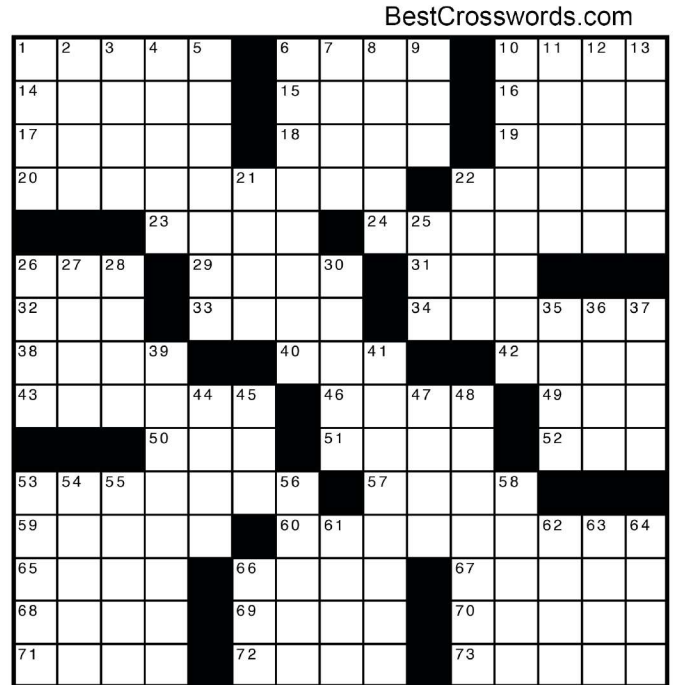
