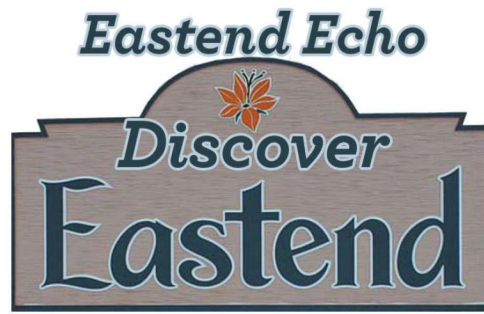

100 Years Ago – 1924

As per the Medical Health Officer, parents whose children attend Eastend School are hereby notified that every pupil of the Eastend School is required to present a certificate or sufficient evidence of immunity from smallpox. This came into effect after the children of a local family attending school had smallpox in their home. Town Council reacted by closing down the school, churches and the Pastime Theatre which was considered drastic by some of the ratepayers. A petition was started and the ban on public buildings and the school was removed.

L.A. Anderson of Frontier has undergone a successful operation at the Mayo Clinic in Rochester. (I find it interesting that the early papers often mention residents having surgery in Rochester).

In Ravenscrag, Fischer & Son have completed an addition to their machinery warehouse. The local auto agent has several orders for cars that will be filled as soon as the roads are passable. Erection of the new school has started and remodeling of the old school will start soon. Many orders of paint have been filled to give the village a bright new look. Arendt's Hall has been remodeled under the expert eye of Bert Manning and a new hardwood floor has been laid so now Ravenscrag can boast of a hall of which any town would be proud.

Gilbertson Bros. of Frontier have moved their large farm house into town. Sixteen horses were required to move the largest section of the residence on skids.

90 Years Ago – 1934

A survey of the grasshopper situation in Sask. has discovered that the Eastend area is severely infested with grasshopper eggs.

Motorists reported a very bad dust storm near Dollard making driving dangerous as at times the road was barely visible.

Alarmed at the decrease of the duck and game bird population as a result of drying up of breeding grounds and a shortage of feed, the Sask. Gov't are considering constructing dams at various sites in Sask. including the Cypress Lake and the Frenchman River.

George Watson, age 58 yrs, died near his home, about 15 miles SE of Eastend, after being struck down by a runaway team while feeding his stock. Mr. Watson was one of the earliest pioneers of the district coming from England in 1892 homesteading in the Bear Creek area. In 1898 he started out for the Yukon but met with disaster in the heavy musket and quagmire and this venture was abandoned. He then journeyed to South Africa and joined a mounted rifle regiment there. He returned and settled in the Whitemud and was one of the largest land holders in the municipality where he was Reeve at the time of his death. Mel Bascom was later asked to manage the ranch and went on to purchase it in 1946.

Dr. O'Brien of Frontier has been busy operating and in the last month performed 2 appendectomies and 2 hernia repairs on Loomis residents.

80 Years Ago – 1944

Many of the local overseas "boys" have sent their acknowledgement and thank the area for cigarettes, newspapers and parcels they have received from home. Sergt. Andy Elder, RCAF, in England says thanks and to keep the smokes a'rolling.

At Ravenscrag, the Wallasey Junior Red Cross are having a Bazaar and Tea at the Station and

the Pottruff ladies are having a dance at North Bench School to raise funds for the Red Cross.

A couple of carloads of people from the Robsart area went to Maple Creek to donate blood. The Canadian Red Cross is calling on all loyal Canadians to back up their fighting men by keeping dried bloodserum available.

Notice by B.S. Walters, Town Clerk, that all parties wishing to retain their garden plots must have their leases renewed before April 1st. Failure to do so will result in leasing the same to the first applicant.

Ration books can be picked up at the Board of Trade room from 10 am – 5 pm on March 29th and 30th. For the convenience of those who may be unable to come to town on those days, books can be given out before. March 30th is the cut off date and none will be issued after that date.

70 Years Ago – 1954

The town curfew has again been put into operation following a long period of silence. The siren at 9:00 pm is a warning for youngsters 15 and under to get off the street and head for home. It is aimed at boys and girls who loaf in the vicinity of the cafe and such places creating a nuisance when they should be at home studying. In such cases children will be escorted home by the town policeman.

A play "Devil Among the Skins", directed by Mr. A. Bauche, was chosen to compete in the semi finals of southern Sask. being held in Regina. Taking part are Walter Pearson, Maxine Kendrick, Ronnie Bascom and Virgil Wethal. Walter Pearson was awarded the best actor.

60 Years Ago – 1964

A large crowd attended the third annual Ice Carnival sponsored by the Eastend Kinettes.

Miss Anne Noland graduated from the Blanche MacDonald Ltd. Modelling school in Vancouver.

Severe dust storms were reported west and south of Eastend with poor visibility.

Consul curlers are very pleased with the 40 rinks that participated in their first annual artificial ice bonspiel.

An auction sale will be held at the farm of Tom Miller, close to Loomis.

50 Years Ago – 1974

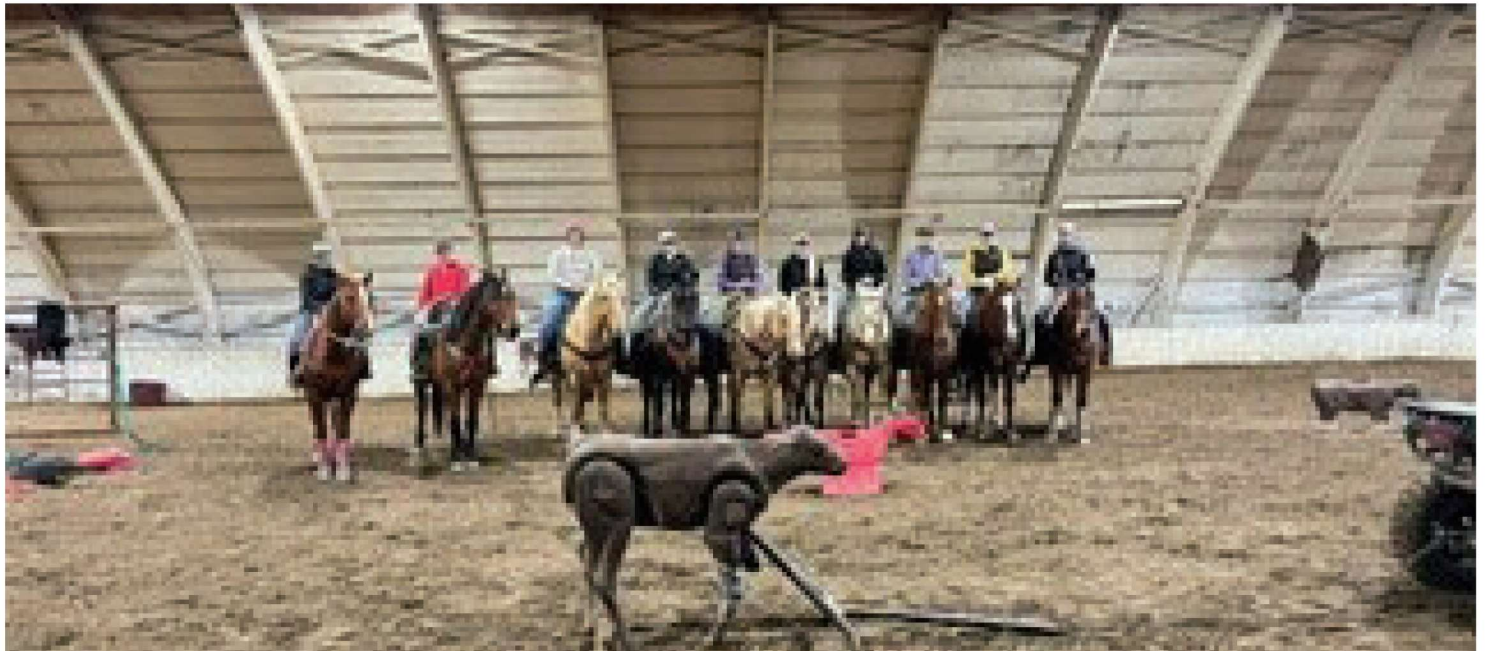
Mrs. Sharon Odegard (Tasche) was the guest speaker at the Metric Commission in Ottawa. Sharon was appointed to the Metric Commission of Sask. with the Dep't of Education as representation for Technical Institutes.

Bill Shourounis flew to Auckland, New Zealand where he will meet Ron MacRae who is working there.

A delegation from the Bracken School District attended the regular meeting of the Eastend School Unit. The purpose of the meeting was to try and forestall closure of the Bracken School which has an attendance of 13 pupils.

Well known business man, Max McGregor, passed away at the age of 75. He was a pharmacist and purchased the Eastend Drug Store in 1927 and retired and sold his store in 1954. In 1961 he opened the McGregor Variety Store in Shaunavon which he operated until 1972.

Paige Mizu (*First MRCA Ladies Breakaway Roping Champion/ 2X CCA Finalist/ 5X NHSRA qualifier, 2X Canadian Finals Breakaway qualifier*) held a breakaway clinic March 10 at the Eastend Arena . 9 people attend and had a great day of fun and learning. 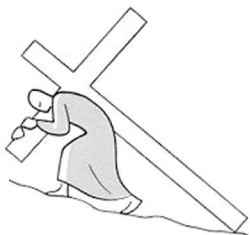

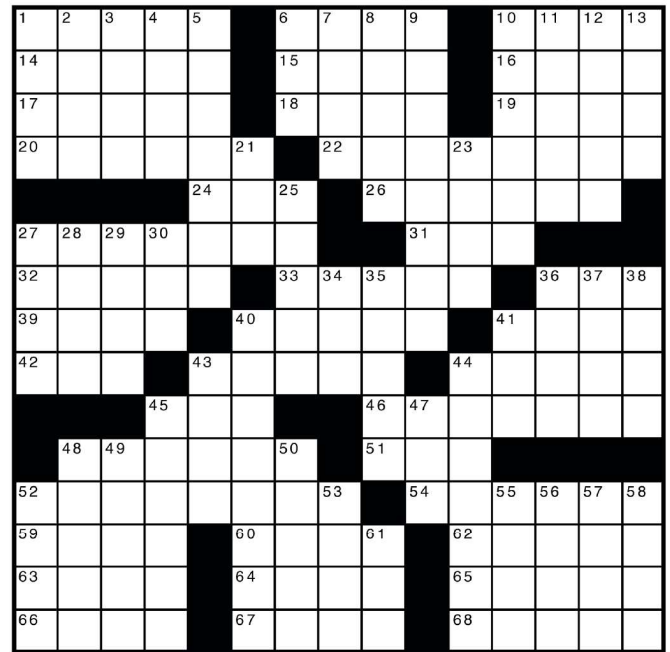
