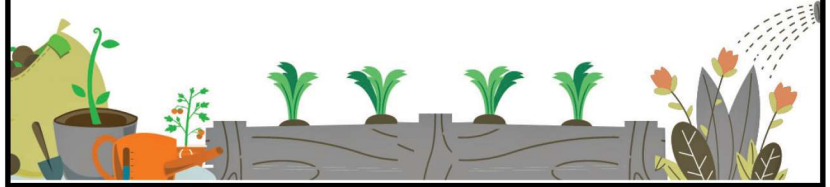

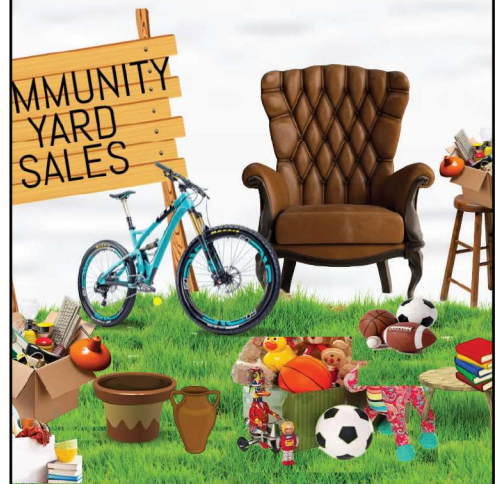

100 Years Ago – 1924

The Tree Planting Car (train) of the Canadian Forestry Assoc, now on its 5th annual tour of the prairie provinces, will visit Eastend. Lectures will be given in the evening for adults & during the day for school children. The date for Arbor day in Saskatchewan is the second Friday in May.

The tennis courts are getting a thorough overhauling; new nets & back stops have been erected & the courts are in first class condition.

A petition is being circulated for a road from Eastend to Ravenscrag. This will service the western neighbours both north & south of the valley. A provincial engineer is in town locating a crossing for a new steel bridge at the west end of town.

The Town of Eastend has obtained title to the Crawford & Jones barn & is leasing it to B.F. Patterson to convert to a dance hall.

The "Southfork Breeze" column mentions the "Bucket of Blood" which in the booming days of Southfork was a combination of saloon, gambling house & dance hall. Many a sanguinary gun & knife battle were fought in & around this one storey frame building on the center of Main St. The building still stands but it has been cleaned & scrubbed & religious services are held regularly by the mission society which is supported by all denominations.

May 24th is Eastend's Sports Day with a first prize of \$100, 2nd prize - \$50 & \$25 for third prize.

Jim Mryden, of the Eastbrooke district, was injured while bringing home a couple of young horses from Ravenscrag. He managed to reach D. McCuaig's home & was taken to the Eastend Red Cross Outpost. The neighborhood of 21 men using 90 horses, 4 drills, 7 gang plows, etc, under the direction of Ole Sather, plowed 30 acres & disced & drilled in some 80 acres of wheat crop in a single day.

Under the town bylaw, the summer half day holiday on Wednesday comes into effect on June 1st each year & remains in effect until August 15th.

The "Marble Dome Café" at the corner of State Street in Ravenscrag is now under the management of Peter Siemens & will be renamed "The White Lunch".

90 Years Ago – 1934

Jens Uglum, 27 years, died in the Jubilee hospital from suspected poisoning. Two trained nurses were engaged & he was under the constant care of Drs. Burnham & Storey.

Grasshoppers are on the rampage; the warm weather has hatched out millions. Mixing stations are ready & dealing out poison to the farmers.

Senate has the highest altitude of any railroad station in Saskatchewan at 3173' above sea level. The highest railway point in the province is 2.5 miles east of Robsart with an altitude of 3196'. Highest point in the province is in Cypress Hills at 4546'.

Eastend Tennis Club held a successful tournament with 75 entries coming from Eastend, Dollard, South Fork, Robsart & Consul.

80 Years Ago – 1944

Ira Kendrick passed away in Regina. He was born in 1882 in Tennessee & came to the Eastbrooke area in 1909. He is survived by his wife, daughter Neva Grundler & brother Sam of Eastend.

70 Years Ago – 1954

A 4-H rally was held at Cypress Park with 200 boys & girls attending from Montana & approximately 500 from southwest Sask. Hugh Robinson, agricultural representative from Eastend, started the inter-country visits 7 years ago.

Messrs. H. & E. Leger are excavating a basement for a Pool house which is to be moved into Divide.

The circus arrived in Eastend & shortly after a thunderstorm with 1/3" of rain shut down the rides & all took refuge in the tents. The next morning a bull elephant, one of 3 with the circus, decided to go to the river a short distance away, for an early morning swim. His 2 tons of bulk soon had him mired in the mud & he was exhausted when his keeper found him a couple of hours later. He had to be fitted with a harness & his trainer was chest deep in the water adjusting the heavy belts. With the aid of a winch, the elephant soon had his feet on dry ground& that is the story of the runaway elephant in Eastend!

After spending a year's service in Korea with the 25th Canadian Infantry Brigade, Lord Strathcona Horse Troopers, G.H. Kopitoski, M.J. Priddle & Len Wehr are expected home soon.

A fire at Ravenscrag destroyed the Whipple Hotel, Metzger's Store & a house belonging to Jim Fletcher. The Whipple Hotel & Metzger's store had shut down several months before the fire. The fire truck & fire chief, &re Bidaux, came out from Eastend.

60 Years Ago – 1964

Building is booming in Eastend; Don Lafrance is working on a new residence belonging to the Eastend School Unit with Mr. & Mrs. Jones moving in. A new Co-op house is also being constructed by Lafrance. Four lots, north of Peter Shourounis', will soon have new homes & Kirby Bengtson is digging for the sewer & water lines.

A brown trout, caught by Don Cornelius north of Eastend, weighed 13 pounds & is believed to be the largest caught in this area.

Dr. Peter Morrison opened his practise in Eastend & will have a clinic once a week in Consul. He & his family are living in Russell Egl's house.

50 Years Ago – 1974

A farewell party was held for Mr. & Mrs. R&y Townsend. R&y is taking more Co-op administrative training in Saskatoon. Art Routledge will take over as service station manager at the Eastend Co-op.

A farewell party was held for Mr. & Mrs. Don Lewis who are moving to Kelowna, BC.

Moving into the new apartment building on Centre St. are Mrs. Marjory Lewis, Mrs. Flossie Arendt, Mr. & Mrs. Sam Kendrick & Mr. & Mrs. Emile Lafrance. Lafrance's have sold their home to Mr. & Mrs. Ray Breton.

Gus Bancescu has retired from Pioneer Grain after many years of service. Larry Sawden of Consul will fill the position.

The farewell for Dr. delos Santos & family was well attended with about 150 people enjoying the music & dancing.

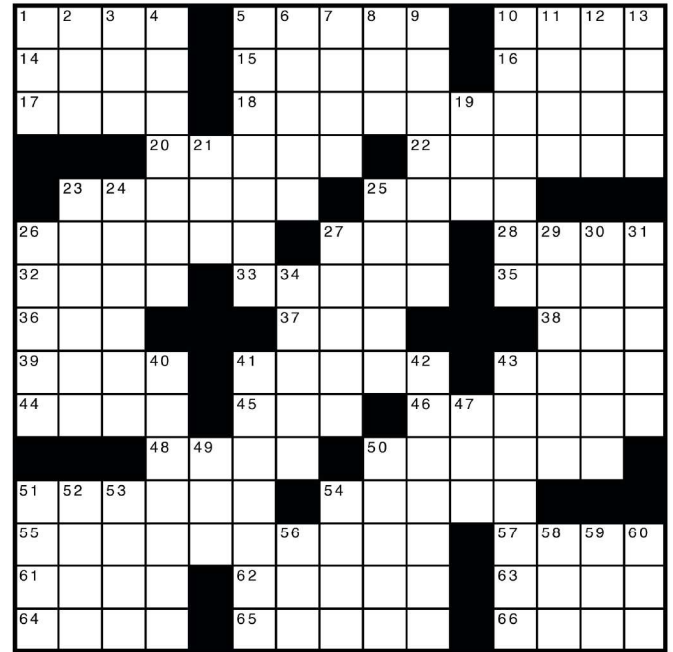


